
Dear Colonel Moore:



OVERALL RATING OF CLINICAL TEACHING AREA:

Professor Jones was observed during a clinical day from 12:30-2:30 pm (Nursing 250 Lab). Before post-conference at 1:15 pm, Prof. Jones supervised a student during medication administration and patient care. She was supportive and offered feedback and positive questioning, which was an effective teaching approach. Overall, she is extremely positive in her interactions with the students, and they are very responsive.

For the post-conference, she provided opportunities for each of the students to share the highlights of the day's experiences with the group. Several patients were treated for cardiac problems, and Prof. Jones effectively connected assessments and therapies to the pathophysiology involved. She explained physiological changes in a manner that enhanced students' understanding. The post-conference was lively--it was clear that the students were at ease and readily participated. Prof. Jones provided a trusting and supportive, yet academically challenging, environment.

I reviewed her anecdotal records and her system for organizing student assignments. She is very organized and gives students timely feedback on both written assignments and clinical performance. She interacts effectively with the nursing staff, and I was given unsolicited feedback indicating that the staff enjoys having her on the unit as clinical faculty. Overall, she is an effective clinical instructor. Thank you for this opportunity.
