The class was allowed to interview (history assessment) both guests and utilize the nursing process in assisting with common occurrences/problems for these types of patients.**

# **Formative Evaluations community experience (visit to Rehab Center) and class guest (interview/history taking of 9 year old Glioblastoma patient): integration of the nursing process.**

The experience on the 13th helped me by realizing that, even though many of the patients I encounter in health care situations will be in critical conditions and may die, I become a better person for knowing them/knowing about them. It was hard to see such a sweet little boy struggling for his life and even harder to think about the likely possibility of his death, but at the same time, it made me want to be the kind of nurse that would "put on a super hero cape" just because my patients wanted me to. I saw someone in a hard situation, and felt how hard it was emotionally even from that brief moment of listening to him speak about how difficult his life was, and then decided that I still want to go into nursing so that I can know and help people like him.

The experience was educational in many ways and a good overall experience for me to have at this point of my education. I need to be exposed to the very real possibility that many of my future patients can and will die despite everything that medicine can do for them. The presentation made me cry a little, but after class I really had the realization that I would rather feel that pain and help patients like him and get to know them than to have never known them and felt for them.

I would definitely like more of these type of presentations. I wish we could come to class a few more times that what is currently scheduled so that we could have that option.

The community experience was helpful because it was a good opportunity for the class and me to learn from your experience and be exposed to a new healthcare atmosphere. Orem Nursing and Rehab was much larger than all of the other Nursing Homes/Assisted living facilities I've seen thus far, and I found your presentation to be very educational.

I noticed how many people were living in a small building and how many of them had to wait to get out of bed for breakfast while I was on this tour and I thought about how important it is for me, as a CNA currently, to do the very best work I can so that living in a home is as positive of an experience as it possibly can be for the residents there. Your presentation also made me think about my own desire to work with the elderly and be a positive, proactive influence to future coworkers and possibly for the overall management of the facility.

I like the way class is being presented. I liked our field trip and guest speaker especially. I haven't had much of a chance to hear your lectures because we are hardly ever in class together, which is actually something I dislike. I like our online discussions and I have really liked how you have responded to each student post and been involved in the discussions, shedding your greater knowledge of various topics on them. Most professors (at least from what I've heard/seen on a limited basis) wouldn't take the time to do that. I really like how much experience you have had in the Nursing field and I feel like you have a lot of knowledge to offer our class.

I don't like the course because I have no idea what to expect for our final examination that is such a large percentage of our grade. This lack of information is causing me a great deal of stress. I don't like it because we are hardly ever in class together and I feel like we have a lot to learn from you, especially because this is an introduction to nursing class and we don't know anything about the breadth of the topic yet.

**I noticed that** Orem Rehabilitation is very clean. I noticed that the rooms were individualized; some people had a lot of clutter and others did not. I also noticed that there was a variety of people. Some looked like they had just come out of surgery and were recovering and others looked like they may live there permanently. I noticed many oxygen concentrators.

**While I was on this tour and I thought about** my mom (she's 85) and has lived with my family since 1990. She has limited mobility (with a walker, she's supposed to be with it – she recently broke her shoulder because she was not with her walker) and requires a lot of assistance, but it made me sad to think about her living in a place like Orem Rehab full-time, even though it was a nice place.

I also thought about my mother-in-law. She lives in Washington State and lives full-time in an assisted living home because she has severe dementia.

I guess ultimately it made me think about my own health. I really am trying to take care of myself because I don't want to be dependent on others to care for me when I'm old.

**I like the way class is being presented.** It is working well for me. I do well with assignments being given and turning them in by a specified deadline. I don't always feel that 'sitting' in class is the best way to learn.
